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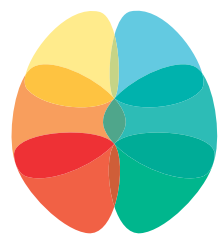
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PUCRS: 70 years of tradition and commitment to the future

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INTRODUCTION

Innovative for 70 years

The Pontifícia Universidade Católica do Rio Grande do Sul (PUCRS), the world's first Catholic university, turned 70 years old in 2018. In line with the educational tradition of the Marist Brothers, inspired by Saint Marcellin Champagnat, the institution seeks to respond to the needs of society, towards the construction of a better future. PUCRS is keen to generate innovation and development, in all of their dimensions - social, environmental, cultural, economic and scientific -, through its strategic positioning. It acknowledges the value of people, whose comprehensive development is, above all, what the University is here for.

The institution's cornerstone was the Undergraduate Degree in Business Administration and Finance, established in March 1931 by Br. Afonso (Charles Herbaux). It was recognized as a University on November 9, 1948. The title of Pontifical, granted on November 1st, 1950, by

Pope Pius XII, marks its union and filial devotion to the Holy See. As a Catholic confessional institution, it has the Archbishop of Porto Alegre as its Chancellor.

As a private nonprofit entity, PUCRS has a legal bond to its supporter, the União Brasileira de Educação e Assistência - UBEA, a legal entity governed by private law. It has been recognized as a Private Non-Profit Higher Education Institution (ICES) by Directive No. 632, dated Oct 30, 2014. It comprises its Main Campus, in Porto Alegre, the capital of Rio Grande do Sul, and a second unit of the Science and Technology Park (Tecnopuc) in Viamão, in the Greater Metropolitan Area.

PUCRS' REFERENCE FRAMEWORK

The Pontifícia Universidade Católica do Rio Grande do Sul is a Non-Profit Higher Education Institution devoted to teaching, research and extension. It has a very strong relationship with society, as it is engaged in the training of responsible, independent, innovative and charitable citizens with an eye to the scientific, cultural, social and economic development. As civil society institution, PUCRS recognizes the democratic and republican values of the Rule of Law, as it respects the fundamental rights and human dignity. It is governed by its Statute, its By-Laws and existing legal norms. The reference of its identity lies in the Christian faith and in the educational tradition of the Marist Brothers. The institution is firmly committed to the promotion and protection of humanity, life and the environment.

Mission

Based on human rights, on the principles of Christianity, and on the tradition of education of the Marist Brothers, the Mission of PUCRS is to produce and disseminate knowledge and promote human and professional development, driven by quality and relevance, with an eye to the development of a just and fraternal society.

Vision for the future

By 2022, PUCRS will have become, in accordance with its Mission, an international reference in Higher Education through innovation and social, environmental, scientific, cultural and economic development.

ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2018

- PUCRS is the best private university in the south of Brazil, as shown in the General Index of Higher Education Programs (IGC) published by the Ministry of Education (MEC) in December. The Institution achieved 3.5719 points, within band 4 of Continuous IGC – in a scale that goes from 1 to 5. PUCRS also ranks 4th in a list compiled by MEC that includes the best universities in the state of Rio Grande do Sul, including private, federal and state universities. According to the list, PUCRS' Master's programs feature as the best programs in Brazil.
- In December, PUCRS received the Eva Sopher Award by the *Fundação Teatro São Pedro*. This is the first time the award was given. The Chamber of Book of the State of Rio Grande do Sul, the Social Service of Commerce and four other cultural exponents received the award, too. The award is named after the Foundation's former president, who served as a director of the theater in 1975 and stayed there until the day she died, in February 2018. Over the course of the year, more than 80 cultural activities took place at the University. PUCRS opened its doors to 243 musicians and drama artists, 47 writers as well as 184 researchers and students. The actions attracted an audience as large as 15,000 people.

The São Lucas Hospital of PUCRS (HSL) was founded in 1976 by the União Brasileira de Educação e Assistência, a civil society of the Institute of the Marist Brothers of the South-Amazon Brazil Province. Its mission is to "promote life". It sits in an area that congregates high-complexity facilities and a complete structure to promote the health of the population.

HSL is nationally and internationally recognized. It stands out for its interdisciplinary health care activities as well as teaching and research. All these actions are in line with the perspective of

innovation and the continuous quest for sustainable management as it provides high-quality services.

The hospital serves more than 100,000 people every year - in urgency and emergency care alone -, as well as hospitalizations, medical appointments, exams and surgeries, for both adults and pediatric patients, in basically all medical specialties. It is equipped with cutting-edge and efficient medical equipment, technologies and management practices.

- It has been certified, for the second time, by the Surgical Review Corporation (SRC), as an International Center of Excellence for the Treatment of Morbid Obesity.



High quality assistance and research

Brains opened its doors in 2012. It is supported by the União Brasileira de Educação e Assistência (Ubea), and is led by a team of world-renowned neuroscientists. The institute is committed to providing high quality diagnostic imaging services through the development and the employment of innovative technologies. It is home to a number of researchers and professors of PUCRS in an effort to firmly connect scientific research with academic professionals and medical care. The Institute has three fronts of action: development of cutting-edge research; the Center for Production

of Radiopharmaceuticals and the Imaging Center. Concerted actions involving these fronts are the foundations for the high-quality level assistance and research carried out at Brains.

In 2018, Brains-RS began its expansion activities. The built area will become three times as large and, by 2020, the Institute will become a reference in neuroscience in Brazil and abroad.

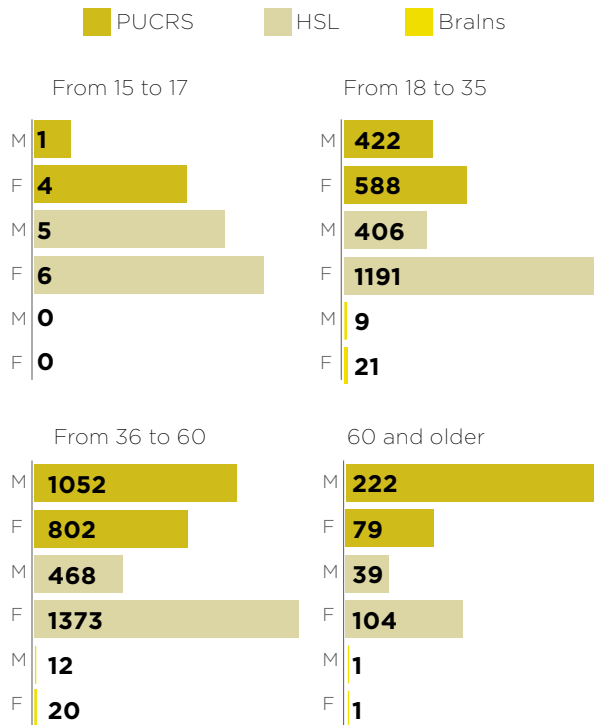
PEOPLE MANAGEMENT

Age group

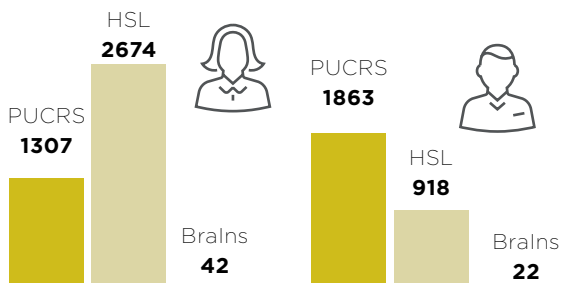


Total per department

TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

EDUCATION

MAJORS AND MINORS AND FINANCIAL AID FOR GRADUATE SCHOOL

To transform people's lives and society overall has always been one of the goals of PUCRS, a University that develops projects, makes dreams come true and contributes to the development of people for the world. In 2018, important activities were put in practice for the consolidation of institutional projects. The eight Academic Schools are now fully consolidated, as the following schools opened their doors in March: School of Sciences, School of Health Sciences, School of Communications, Arts and Design - FAMECOS and the School of Technology.

The actions in support of the Movement of Transformation PUCRS 360°, under the

perspective of Learning Autonomy, now make it possible for students to complete a Minor in any academic area: these are a number of courses that are completed by students towards the completion of their degree. Overall, the University has introduced 22 minors in the areas of Business, Engineering and Communications.

All minors are in accordance with MEC's and regulatory agencies. As for Graduate Programs, new funding opportunities are available for *Master's and Doctorate* students. They are now entitled to a 50% loan. Upon completion of the program, students are expected to pay it back.

Institutional Evaluation

In line with the provisions of the National System of Higher Education Assessment (SINAES), PUCRS develops self-evaluation processes with the internal community and external community as well, as shown in the Anísio Teixeira National Institute for Educational Studies and Research (INEP/Ministry of Education) evaluation records.

The internal evaluation is carried out by Assessment Committees (CPA/CTA), and its results provide insights for the continuous improvement of teaching, research and extension activities. Information about ongoing internal evaluations and their results can be found on www.pucrs.br/avaliacao-institucional/.

IGC MEC

As for external evaluation, results published by the INEP/MEC on Dec 18, 2018 deserve special attention. In the General Index of Courses, PUCRS received grade 4, which places it as the third best private university in Brazil. The IGC is an indicator of quality of higher education institutions that looks at the quality of undergraduate and graduate programs (Master's and Doctoral programs).

ENADE on the PUCRS Portal

The National Examination of Students' Performance (ENADE) is one of the means employed by the Ministry of Education to assess the quality of education of the higher education institutions in the country. PUCRS has a special link on its website (www.pucrs.br/enade), which includes information on the importance of the exam for the academic and professional career of university students. It also provides general information on the exam, previous editions and dates.

IDEAR - Institute for Research and Development

Idear looks at entrepreneurship as a competence that involves the mobilization of knowledge, skills and attitudes, the exercise of creativity, critical thinking and the exercise of autonomy. Entrepreneurship is taken as something much bigger than the mere creation of companies and organizations. Every semester Idear offers the elective course *Projeto Desafios: Inovação and Impacto Social (Challenges: Innovation and Social Impact)* for all undergraduate students of PUCRS as well as the entire academic and external community, in general. It also promotes lectures, workshops, seminars, practicum activities, informal sessions and advising services. One of such events is the *Torneio Empreendedor and Ideação* (in partnership with the Careers Office), and other events that occur every year.

Idear was invited to be a facilitator for *Ideias do Bem*, an event promoted by the School of Health Sciences on Nov 9 - 10. 81 Biomedicine, Psychology, Physical Education, Nutrition and Dentistry majors, as well as other School of Health Sciences students, took part in the Hackaton-type activity and developed entrepreneurial solutions in health care.

In 2018, the publication *Sou uma ideia a empreender*, a teaching material that is available

online on www.pucrs.br/idear, was created. It brings exercises and reflective activities for the development of entrepreneurial competences in the community.

Premus - Multiprofessional Residency in Health Care

The Multiprofessional Residency in Health Care PREMUS / HSL is an initiative that mirrors the provisions of the Ministry of Health, together with the Ministry of Education, aiming at training professionals to meet the principles of SUS (Unified Health System), especially the principle of Comprehensiveness of Health Care. In 2018, eight specialists graduated from the program, in the following areas: Children's and Adolescent's Health, Diagnostic and Therapeutic Support, Urgency and Medical Physics, in their areas (Nursing, Pharmacy, Medical Physics, Physical Therapy, Nutrition, Psychology and Social Work). Over the course of the year, nine other residents enrolled in the program.

New seats were offered under the Premus program as the Ministry of Health offered 21 opportunities in the aforementioned areas, including Physical Education.

Integration between Teaching and Extension

Tutorial Education Program – PET

Among other things, PET offers additional training opportunities to undergraduate students, by fostering both academic and professional autonomy, emphasizing the principles of tutoring and the relationship between teaching, research and extension. PUCRS' PET group consists of 50 students in the Chemistry, Psychology, Letters, Biological Sciences and Computer Science programs. Students are advised by a faculty member of the institution.

Health Care Education Program – PET Health

PET Health resumed its activities in 2018 under the theme *Interprofessional Studies* after the public project was approved. One of the goals of the project is to contribute to curriculum adaptation in an effort to ensure some degree of uniformity to all the undergraduate programs in the area of Health Care, as brought forth by the National Curriculum Guidelines (DCNs). These strategies will be implemented in view of interdisciplinarity and intersectoriality as fundamental strategies for change, with an eye to the development of professionals and health care.

A national reference according to the Ministry of Education

PUCRS offers 24 Graduate programs (Master's and PhD) recommended by the Brazilian Federal Agency for Support and Evaluation of Higher Education (Capes/MEC). The University was awarded grade 5.36 and is being recognized for having the best graduate programs in the country, according to the Capes / MEC evaluation for the period 2013 - 2016 which included HEIs having 10 or more graduate programs. Today, 11 PUCRS programs have been awarded grades 6 and 7, which place them at the level of international excellence. 10 others have been awarded grade 5, which place them at the level of national excellence, and three other programs earned grade 4.

Internal Evaluation of Graduate Programs

In response to the needs of the National System of Evaluation of Higher Education (SINAES), PUCRS evaluates its *Master's and Doctoral Programs* every two years. Last time they were evaluated was in 2017. In that edition, the level of satisfaction of students was 4.3, which was above the University's initial expectations (4.0). Certificate programs are evaluated every semester. The first time they were evaluated was in 2015.

INTERNATIONALIZATION OF HIGHER EDUCATION

Courses delivered entirely in English

PUCRS has set out that one of the pillars of the Strategic Plan in effect until 2022 will be the Promotion of Internationalization and Interculturality. At the undergraduate level, 15 courses are delivered entirely in English. At the graduate level - Master's and PhD, 14 courses are delivered entirely in a language other than Portuguese. The idea is to increase the number of courses in languages other than Portuguese for both Brazilian and international students.

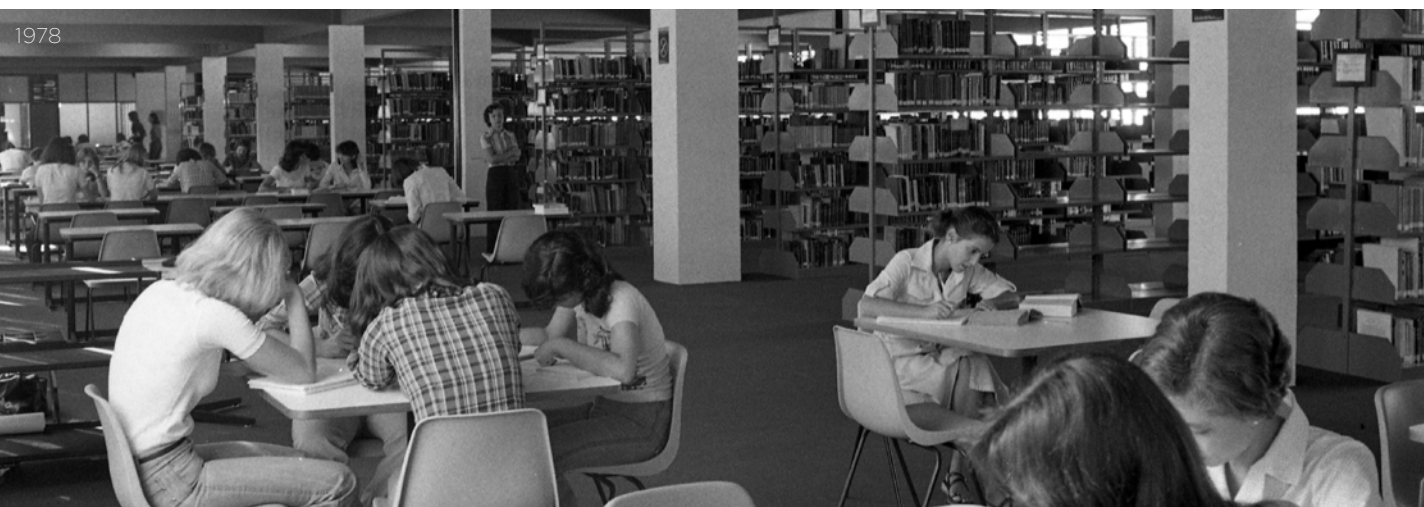

INNOVATION

A LEADING ROLE IN INNOVATION AND DEVELOPMENT

In an effort to mirror the trends of transformation of innovation environments from all over the world, PUCRS has created the Superintendence of Innovation and Development, which is accountable to the President's Office. It is fruit of PUCRS' Strategic Plan in the area of Innovation, which will be in effect for the next 15 years.

The new structure will also serve to increase the role played by the university in the areas of innovation and development in Porto Alegre and in Rio Grande do Sul. In this context, the Inovapucrs Network and the Science and Technology Park (Tecnopuc) are some expressions of this ecosystem of innovation.

INOVAPUCRS NETWORK

The INOVAPUCRS Network congregates a range of actors, actions and mechanisms for promoting innovation and entrepreneurship at PUCRS. To this end, it seeks to engage the actors that are involved with the university, businesses, government and society. It is intended to share the knowledge produced at the University with society. Consequently, it focuses on multidisciplinary efforts to find solutions for economic, social, environmental and cultural development.

The Network comprises both the academic actors - which include the eight Academic Schools: School of Sciences, School of Health Sciences, School of Communications, Arts and Design - Famecos; Law School, School of Humanities, School of Medicine, Business School and the School of Technology, as well as additional structures - laboratories and business units that are intended to connect with the market. Each unit features an Agent of Innovation who is responsible for maximizing the potential of each environment.

That is the most important conference in the area of Interaction Design, User Experience, Technology and Innovation in the region.

This is a structure that has been designed for creativity and prototyping. The Laboratory specializes in a variety of things: development of medical equipment; training and development of personnel; realistic simulation for everyday and adverse scenarios; research activities; telehealth environments, with focus on teleradiology and telechography, with the storage and distribution of images in remote tests.

The development of actions of extension, as one of the forms of expression of Social Responsibility of PUCRS, intends to advance transformative education as the University can connect to other segments of society. This is maximized as extension actions are integrated into the curriculum. This facilitates the learning process as one has professional and interdisciplinary experiences.

They include in a number of activities in support of the public policy of social assistance and the policies implemented by stakeholders. They enable individuals to exercise their civic consciousness actively, within the realm of the said policy. The program advances the guarantees of their rights, and users and social actors involved can have their organization, autonomy and leading role reinforced.

Science and Technology Museum

The mission of the Science and Technology Museum is to generate, preserve and disseminate knowledge through its collections and exhibitions, in order to contribute to the development of science, education and culture. In 2018, 275 people had access to the archives of the scientific collections, including visiting researchers, graduate students as well as undergraduate students. The museum staff also worked on the description of 29 new species found in the Brazilian fauna.

Traveling Museum and *Projeto Escola*

Ten cities in the state of Rio Grande do Sul opened their doors to the Traveling Museum (Promusit) whereas 280 schools opened their doors to the *Projeto Escola* (Proesc). Overall, as many as 241,546 people had the chance to learn from the MCT-PUCRS' experiences and exhibits.

The Museum featured again as one of the most popular ones in the category Museums, in the survey *Top of Mind* Porto Alegre, published by magazine *Amanhã*. The award is given every year since 2011.

Educational Complex

The Educational Complex of PUCRS relies on the MCT-PUCRS to develop teaching, extension and research activities, involving both graduate and undergraduate students. In 2018, 161 activities were offered at the Museum through the Educational Complex.

Sports Park

As a facility designed for sports, PUCRS Sports Park's services and structures are available for physical and leisure activities towards the promotion of a healthy lifestyle. It is available to both University and external users.

Two new initiatives helped increase the number of services offered and strengthened its relationship with the audience: the arrival of Orlando City Soccer School, with focus on the development of soccer skills in children and teenagers, with an educational purpose. This gave priority to integration actions and entertaining activities. Another such initiative was the implementation of open events, such as *Sua Família no Parque*. Overall, it was home to 157 events, including its own and others involving external partners. It attracted more than 36,000 people.

INSTITUTE OF CULTURE

The Institute of Culture embraces a number of initiatives associated with the sociocultural development of the academic community both on and off campus. The Institute oversees Delfos - Center for Documentation and Cultural Memory of PUCRS and the University Choir. It is intent on designing and promoting cultural projects at the Cultura Square and in different areas on Campus.

It promotes a number of activities, including recitals, festivals, lectures, presentations and fairs. They make the campus a cultural complex for the city of Porto Alegre as it strengthens its plurality through music, literature, drama and visual arts.

Cultura Square (Rua da Cultura)

An environment dedicated to fostering art, literature, music and cooking experiences. The Cultura Square was opened on Jun 4, 2018, at the heart of the University Campus. The Square consists of a stage and bleachers and the ATL House, a hub of innovation of radio stations,

equipped with studios and areas for leisure and open air activities. Since the day it was opened, the Institute of Culture and other units within the University implemented a number of cultural actions at the Cultura Square, such as open-air plays, music shows, creative fairs and dance shows. These actions have been included in the strategic planning of the Institute of Culture and are intended to make PUCRS a Cultural Complex.

The Institute of Culture of PUCRS, responsible for the cultural agenda of the University, carried out 116 events, and served an audience as large as 23,000 people.

Three different modalities are offered in view of the different challenges faced by students over the course of their training: Quest START, for freshman students; Quest GO, for senior students and Quest UP for graduate students. 25 seats were offered for each modality, all of which were fully taken on the day they were open.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

PUCRS is keen to generate innovation and development, in all of their dimensions - social, environmental, cultural, economic and scientific as stated in its strategic positioning. This endorses actions that have been promoted for years - and new initiatives as well - , in the sense that it seeks to preserve the environment and implement institutional and educational projects aimed at the respect and sustainable use of natural resources.

The materialization of the activities geared towards the environment is a reality as some of them have been included in undergraduate curricula. The course on Socioenvironmental Studies, of the School of Humanities' Pedagogy Program, is one of such examples. The Environmental Management Committee and Project USE - Sustainable Energy Use are other examples. In addition to that, we can mention the Environmental Management Committee which deals in different segments (water, energy, biodiversity, effluents, waste and others), the USE Project - Sustainable Energy Use as well as the Pró-Mata Center for Environmental Research and Conservation, in São Francisco de Paula (RS).

The Hydrological Atlas of RS

The Interdisciplinary Group of Applied Geophysics has been developing the project Guarani Aquifer Surface Mapping with focus on the mitigation of drought and quality of water. The study has been developed in the central depression of Rio Grande do Sul and includes recharge zone, which absorbs rainwater and feeds the reservoir. The following areas have been visited: Santa Cruz, Quarta Colônia (Agudo, Faxinal do Soturno, Nova Palma and Dona Francisca), Alegrete and Candelária. The idea is to design the Hydrological Atlas of Rio Grande do Sul.

The group includes faculty and undergraduate and graduate students in different academic areas as well as the Institute of the Petroleum and Natural Resources.

The project has been developed in partnership with Unipampa.

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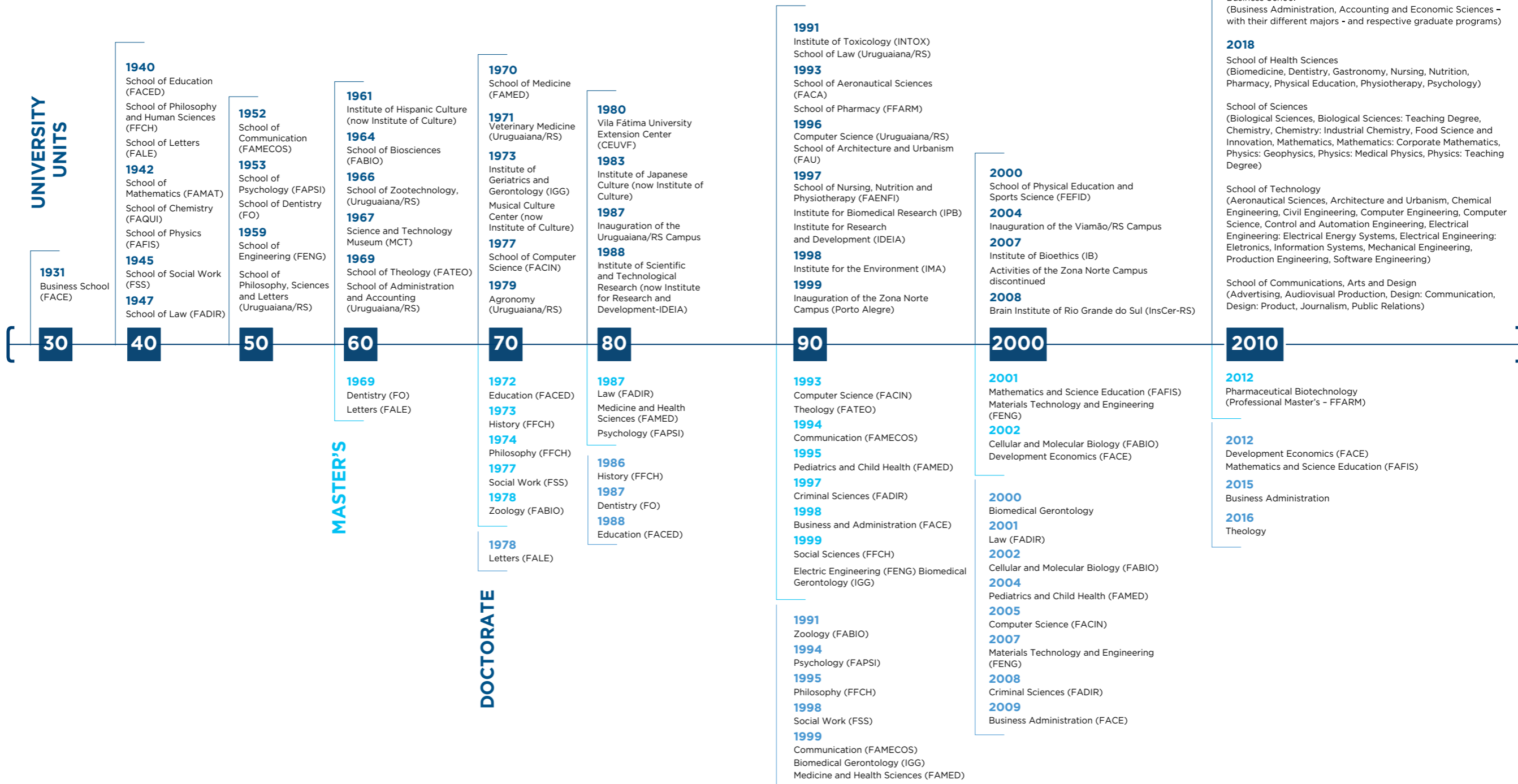
